On August 9 2024, ETAS conducted its first college level event 'Debate Riot' under the guidance of Prof. R.R Harne mam. The Debate Riot was structured into three rounds in which the participants tested their debating skills and spontaneity. The competition took place in the Electronics and Telecommunication department and students from every discipline and all years participated. Total 12 pairs participated in the competition. The teams were Convince us, Balanced perspectives, Bandits, Clashers, Praved, Eloquentnthusiasts, Dominators, Nalanda, Skeptic Alliance, Vivekam, Hunters and Avinya. The competition was successfully organised by ETAS committee.

The competition kicked off with the Debate Round where a total 6 sets of two teams each debated on the topic "Government or Private jobs VS Business or Startups". The teams were judged by ENTC department faculties, Dr. S.S Thakre, Dr. D.V. Rojatkar and Assistant prof. P.L Paikrao. The teams that showcased exceptional debating skills and were able to convincingly present their viewpoints advanced to the next round. Teams who qualified round 1 were Convince us, Balanced perspectives, Praved, Clashers, Skeptic Alliance, Vivekam and Avinya.

The second round combined two different types of impromptu activities: Scribble and Extempore.

- Scribble: In this segment one participant from the team drew a random word on the board and the other guessed. This activity was designed to test participants' creativity and ability to think outside the box.
- Extempore: In this segment, a team was given an unrelated topic on which one of the team members had to deliver a short, impromptu speech. This segment was judged by faculty Prof R.R Harne.

The top-performing teams 'Convince us' and 'Sceptical Alliance' qualified for the final round with highest points.

The Final Debate Round was a head-to-head debate between the winners of the second round.

The two top performing teams articulated their perspectives effectively and debated on the argument "Does technology make us lazy?". They were judged by faculties Prof R.R Harne and Dr D.V. Rojatkar. The final round highlighted analytical and reflective thinking skills of the teams.

Purva Bisne and Manvi Gupta from the team "Convince us" emerged as winning team followed by runner up Harshika Wankhade and Sneha Sawant from team "Skeptic Alliance" .Winners of competition were felicitated by Head of department Dr. P.R. Deshmukh sir, Prof. R.R Harne mam, Dr. D.V. Rojatkar sir and Dr. S.S Thakre mam. The event was a tremendous success thanks to enthusiastic participation by students, expert faculty's guidance and excellent organisation by the entire team of ETAS.
